The American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) takes pleasure in informing you that you passed the 2015 Pediatric Gastroenterology Certifying Examination administered on November 5, 2015. A report of your performance is available in your ABP portfolio.

The names of newly certified pediatricians in pediatric gastroenterology will be sent to the appropriate organizations and directories. The ABP also provides addresses of certified physicians to the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) for its website and to the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP). As a diplomate, you have the option to publish a professional address on both the ABP and ABMS websites. To publish a professional address, please log in to your ABP portfolio and access the "My Contact Information" section.

Your certification status will be posted on the public section of the ABP website. Your certificate will be prepared and forwarded to you in February 2016. Your continued certification by the ABP is contingent upon meeting Maintenance of Certification (MOC) requirements which are shown in detail on the ABP website. We suggest that you visit the ABP website and review your individual portfolio.

In order to receive communications from the ABP regarding your own MOC requirements, news and more, we ask that you keep your email and physical mailing addresses current. You may update that information within your portfolio. Because your portfolio contains private information, please keep your username and password confidential.

IMPORTANT: Pursuant to ABP policy, diplomates must continuously hold valid (current), unrestricted medical licenses. You must inform the ABP of any restriction placed on any medical license you hold within 60 days of action. Failure to notify the ABP of a medical license restriction can result in revocation of your certification.
